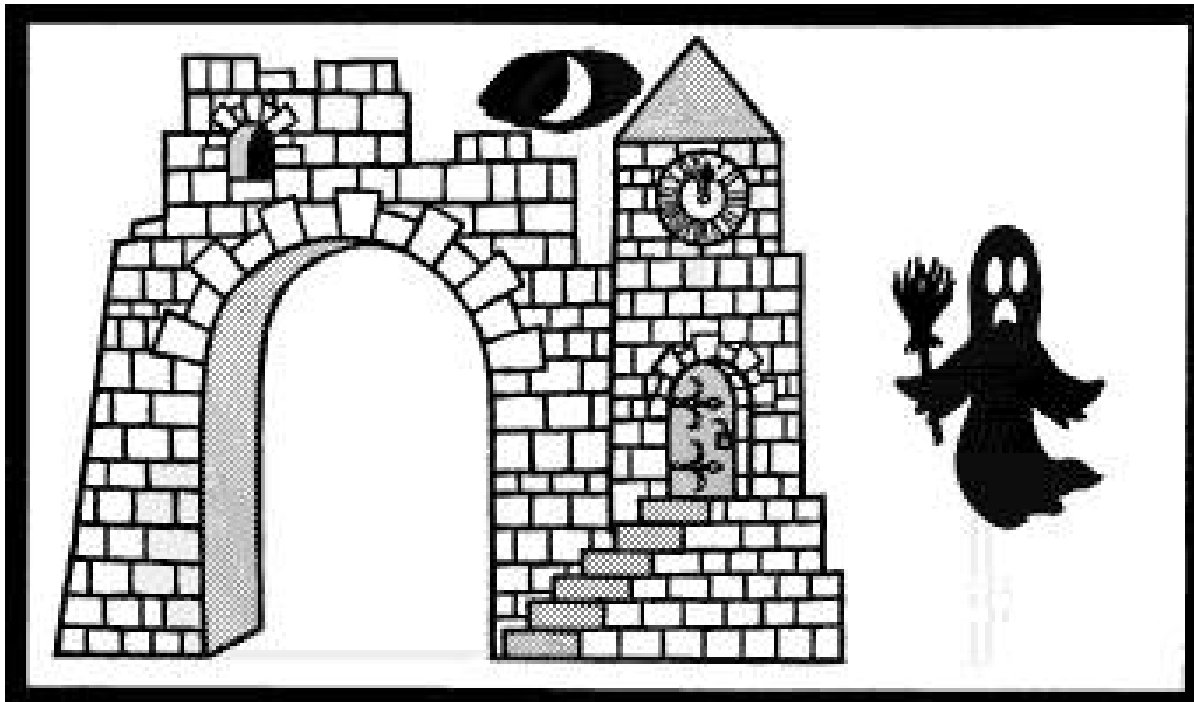

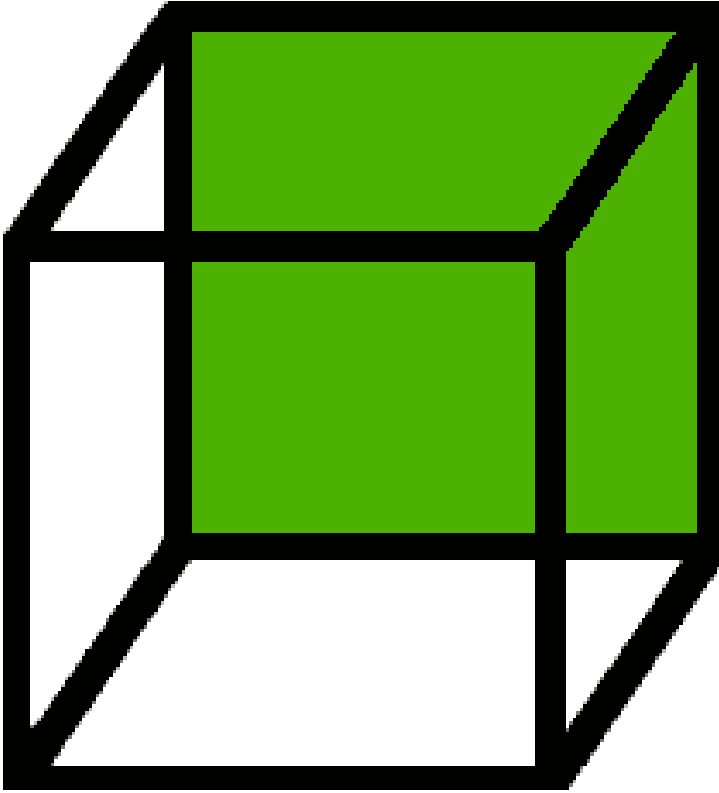

If you look at the mouth of the ghost for 20 seconds and then look at the gate, an afterimage of the ghost will appear there



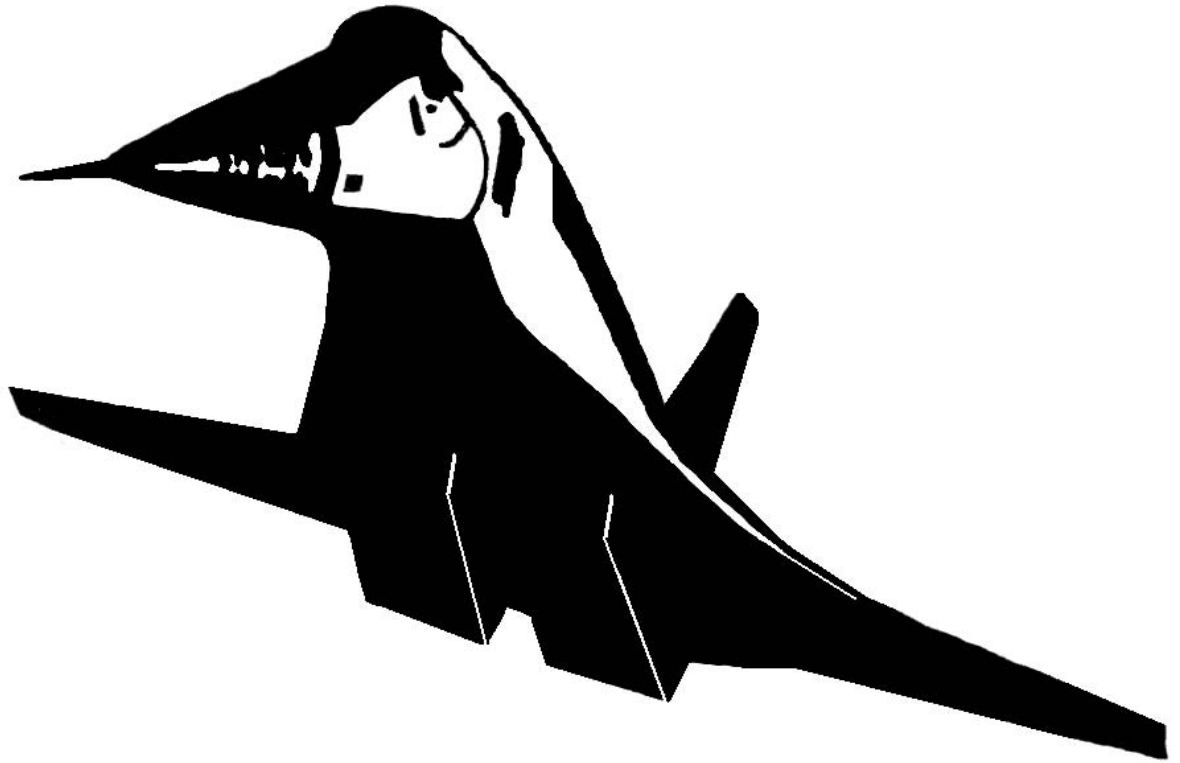
The Necker Cube

This was first found by Professor L. Necker while studying crystals

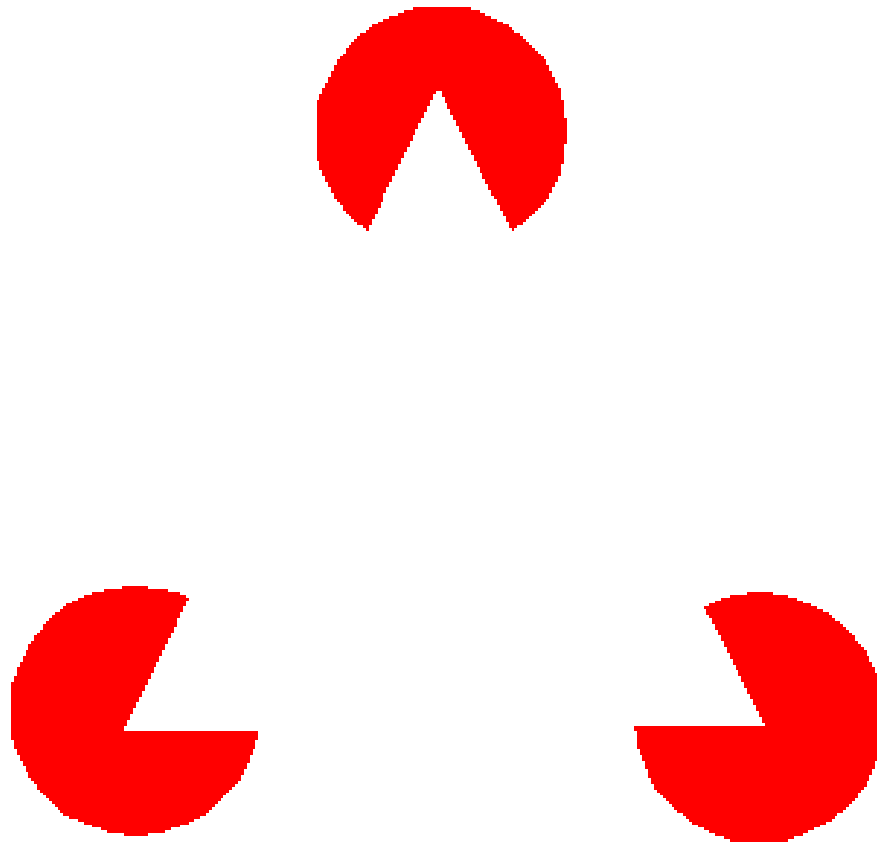
The Concord Ambiguous Illusion

The 'Kanizsa Triangle'



The 'Kanizsa figure' is a closure illusion based on subjective or illusory contours.
